Risk Scores reset every calendar year.


Any lapses or inconsistencies in capturing these recurring chronic

Risk Adjustment Reminders

Annual Well-visits are the best time to document Chronic Comorbid Conditions



M.E.A.T Criteria

Support your Documentation using one of the M.E.A.T. criteria

Monitor

- · How is the patient doing?
- · Are there signs and symptoms?
- Ongoing surveillance of the condition(s).

Assess

- · What is the status of the condition?
- What is the provider's current judgment of the condition?
- This can be the review of results or the treatment outcomes.

Evaluate

- How will the condition(s) be evaluated?
- This can be documentation of prior record review, counseling, or ordering further tests.

<u>T</u>reat

- · What treatment is done for the patient?
- Mention the medication, diagnostic study, or a therapeutic service

Respiratory Virus Chart


FLU SURVEILLANCE:

If you feel like you are drowning in Influenza, well, the data fully supports that reality! The below graph shows that current volume of outpatient visits for influenza-like illness (ILI) is as high as we have seen since before the pandemic. In fact, the US is currently experiencing the HIGHEST LEVEL OF OUTPATIENT ILI VISITS IN THE LAST 15 YEARS. Nationally, ED visits are very high for flu, moderate for RSV, and low for COVID. Most of the influenza circulating is influenza A, but is split between H1N1 and H3N2. It appears the H3N2 strain is not a great match for the vaccine.

What is ECHO Autism?

Moving knowledge, not people A program that supports PCPs looking to improve their ability to care for autistic patients and learn skills necessary to complete diagnostic evaluations in their office. ECHO Autism is an educational program that bridges care gaps between autism specialists, community health care clinicians, and autistic children.

How It Works

PCPs receive training in an office-based diagnostic instrument (STAT) followed by bi monthly educational sessions with didactic and case-based learning in a convenient, interactive web-based small-group format.

KidWell Resource Updates:

Care Coordination: Bridging Gaps in Care: A Story of Teamwork and Community Support

At the heart of our mission is ensuring every patient receives the care they need—even when barriers seem too big to overcome. Recently, our care coordination team demonstrated how collaboration and community engagement make a significant difference in our patients' lives.

Identifying the Challenge

A care coordinator from our KidWell community practice reached out to a patient who had been lost to care. Despite multiple attempts, contact was unsuccessful. Recognizing the urgency, a referral was made to a community health worker, who then visited the patient's home. This visit not only led to scheduling a much-needed well visit but also uncovered several pressing issues affecting the entire family.

Overcoming Barriers with Teamwork

During the well visit, it became clear that the family faced multiple challenges:

- Transportation: The lack of personal transportation was hindering the patient's dental care and the mother's access to an audiologist for her hard-of-hearing diagnosis.
- Housing Concerns: The family's living conditions were not ideal, with damaged furniture due to a
 hot water leak and unsafe drinking water worries stemming from a city issue.

Our care coordinator quickly mobilized resources by:

- Helping the mother navigate Modivcare to secure transportation for both the dental appointment and an audiologist consultation.
- Connecting with local community resources to obtain donated furniture and several cases of safe drinking water.

A Positive Outcome

Through the diligent efforts of the practice team, care coordinator, and community health worker, the family's obstacles were addressed comprehensively. Follow-up calls confirmed that the family was receiving the necessary healthcare and had overcome the transportation, housing, and water quality challenges they faced.

This success story highlights the importance of proactive care coordination and community collaboration. It serves as a reminder of how addressing social determinants of health can lead to improved outcomes for our patients and their families.

Together, we are not just coordinating care—we are transforming lives.

Just a friendly reminder to please complete the GPO (Group Purchasing Organization) vaccine initiative spreadsheet that was emailed by Danielle Burns on August 20th, 2024.

This initiative is a fantastic opportunity to potentially reduce your vaccine costs. To participate, we need your help in understanding your annual vaccine purchase volume.

Key Points:

- The spreadsheet is organized into four tabs: Combo 2 & 7, COVID, Flu, and Other.
- Each tab asks two key questions for each vaccine:
 - What quantity of each NDC was ordered?
 - o Where did you order the vaccine from?

Your timely completion of this spreadsheet is essential for us to move forward with this initiative and potentially unlock cost savings for your practice.
