



### Pediatric Epistaxis (Nosebleeds) — What to Know Contributed by Dr. Schmidt, Nemours Surgery Department

#### Overview

- · Epistaxis is common in children and usually benign.
- · Recurrent or severe cases may signal local or systemic causes.

#### **Common Local Factors**

- Prominent anterior septal vessels (Kiesselbach's plexus)
- · Dry air / low humidity
- Minor trauma (e.g., nose picking)
- · Upper respiratory infections
- Allergic rhinitis
- Foreign body
- Structural abnormalities (septal deviation, perforation)

#### **Less Common Systemic Causes**

- · Coagulopathies (hemophilia, von Willebrand disease)
- · Platelet dysfunction (ITP, medications)
- Hypertension

Consider systemic disease if nosebleeds are recurrent, >15-20 min, or accompanied by easy bruising or family history of bleeding disorders.

#### **Initial Assessment**

- 1. History: frequency, duration, laterality, triggers, family/medication history.
- 2. Exam: vitals, anterior rhinoscopy (bleeding site, mucosal dryness), systemic stigmata.

#### **Acute Management**

- · Sit upright, lean forward.
- Pinch soft part of nose for 10-15 min without interruption.
- · Consider oxymetazoline on cotton ball while applying pressure.


#### **Prophylactic Management**

- · Treat contributing factors (e.g., allergic rhinitis).
- Use humidification or saline spray.
- · Apply antibiotic ointment to anterior septum BID x 14 days.
- · Nail trimming/behavior modification.

#### **Referral Considerations**

- · ENT: if prophylaxis fails, posterior bleed suspected, or structural abnormality present.
- · Hematology: if recurrent/severe (>20 min), family history, or coagulopathy suspected.

Most pediatric epistaxis is benign and anterior, responding to local pressure and conservative management. Persistent or atypical cases warrant specialty evaluation.

### ACIP Updates

- MMRV: Removed as an option for the first dose due to seizure risk; still recommended for 4–6 yr dose.
- Hep B: No vote (proposal to move birth dose to 30 days).
- COVID-19: Recommended for everyone >6 months; decision should be made in partnership with clinicians.

### Measles 2025 (as of Sept 16)

- 1,491 cases across 42 jurisdictions; 92% outbreak associated.
- 38 outbreaks; 21 cases among international visitors.
- Hospitalizations: 181; Deaths: 3.
- Case breakdown:
  - <5 yrs: 407 cases (21% hospitalized)
    </p>
  - 5-19 yrs: 574 cases (7% hospitalized)
  - 20+: 501 cases (11% hospitalized)
- CDC issued HAN guidance for the expanding outbreak and travel season.
